"Self Isolation"

I apologize for the less than uplifting title I have chosen for this article. However, it has been six months since we began to isolate ourselves. Although I appreciate the extra time I am spending

with family, not having to commute, and a variety of other "benefits" from not having to go "out," still staying at home and self-isolating is beginning to feel burdensome. As I mentioned earlier I do appreciate being able to spend time with the family. However, at the same time, not interacting with others outside of the family is making me feel "dull." What topics of conversation can you introduce to people who have seen and experienced the exact same things you have? There is relatively nothing "new" to share. These circumstances do not help us to distract ourselves from the fear and danger we find ourselves trapped in our homes by.

Recently I find that it is harder to avoid the feeling of being trapped in the way I have tried to describe above. Fortunately, at the same time, I was reminded of the story of Queen

Vaidehi as told in the Contemplation Sutra. In the Contemplation Sutra, one of the three Pure Land Sutra, we are told how she was imprisoned in the palace by her son Ajatasatru who had just usurped the throne from his father, the King Bimbisara.

In this story found in the Contemplation Sutra we are told of how Sakyamuni Buddha enters the holding area of the Queen completely unnoticed and uninterrupted. Part of what makes this story interesting is the fact that it seems that if Sakyamuni Buddha wanted to the Buddha could have easily freed the Queen from her captivity. The fact that the Buddha does not free the Queen has been commented on from the past. We are told that the story is also being told to each and every one of us. We, too, are confined in our own ways. The covid-19 pandemic is a circumstance that shows us what is meant by the Sutra as experienced by all of us physically. On the other hand, even without the covid-19 pandemic we are all, in one way or another, confined by our fears and worries, our limitations and prejudices, and even by our concerns and responsibilities. For example, there are times when we feel "trapped"

inside our own bodies or circumstances. That the Buddha did not free the Queen helps us to understand that we will never be able to escape ourselves.

The story of the former Queen Vaidehi and her son, the present King Ajatasatru, is continued in the Nirvana Sutra. The Nirvana Sutra records the final lessons and the final moments of Sakyamuni Buddha's physical life. In the Nirvana Sutra Queen Vaidehi is still found inside the confines of her jail. She is, however, no longer "jailed." She has been free of her jailing from the time of the conclusion of the Contemplation Sutra. In the Contemplation Sutra we are told:

Marveling at this unprecedented occurrence, Vaidehi as if clouds of doubt had cleared, attained the great enlightenment and acquired the insight into the non-origination of all existence.¹

In other words, Queen Vaidehi was able to overcome the circumstances of her jailing. Similarly, Buddhism cannot and will not tell us that we can avoid death. The first Noble Truth of "Life is Suffering" is not canceled by the third Noble Truth of "There is an End to Suffering." Instead, we are able to overcome the truth of suffering, just as Queen Vaidehi, while physically still being imprisoned, is actually free.

Although I will more than likely continue to

complain about my circumstances, including the ongoing covid-19 self-isolation, I also find myself grateful that I have been reminded of how big a gift Namo Amida Butsu really is.

仏教には『当今末法、 現是五濁悪世』"今は 末法、五つの濁りにお おわれた悪世の時代" というお言葉がありま すが、それを実感させ

末法とは釈尊が入滅(亡くなられる)されて一定期間が過ぎた最終段階で、仏教の教えは存続しているものの修行する者も覚者もいないという濁りきった世のことを言います。五濁とは、末法の世で避け難い五つの社会的・精神的・肉体的な汚のことです。

五濁(五つの汚れ)とは

- 1. 劫濁=疫病・飢饉・動乱・戦争が続発する
- 2. 見濁=邪悪で汚れた考え方や思想がはびこる
- 3. 煩悩濁=欲望や憎しみなど煩悩によって起こされる悪徳が横行する
- 4. 衆生濁=人々の資質が衰えた状態になる
- 5. 命濁=自他の生命が軽んじられる、生きる意義が見失われる等です。

もう何十年も前の話ですが、私の知り合いのお 寺で大きな法要の前夜に火事が起きました。消 防が来て一旦その火は消えたかに思えたので すが、数時間経って屋根裏に潜んでいた火種が また燃え上がり、その場に居合わせた者が火事 の恐ろしさを語っていました。

大雨が続くと土に含まれた雨が飽和状態になり 一気に土砂がくづれ家ごと巻き込まれたと言う 土砂災害をよく見聞きします。

また今期カリフォルニアの山火事は落雷による ものが多発し、空気は煙の匂いがし、空は不気 味なオレンジ色に染まり森林の燃えた灰が私の 住む地域にもたくさん落ちて来ました。森林で暮らす多くの動物たちが逃げ惑う姿が目に浮かび可哀想で可哀想で思わずお念仏を称えたものでした。

1週間ほど前、夜中に地震で目が覚め久しぶりの地震に不安を覚えました。そう言えばカリフォルニアでは、数十年の間に大きな地震がくると警告されています。今回の震源地はSo. San Gabriel で、そのエリアには西別院の開教使住宅があり以前私たちも住んでいたところでした。

近年の地震・台風・津波・山火事は想像を絶する大きな災害となり世界中自然災害による危機 感は増していると思います。まさに劫濁の時代 です。

最近ニュースを聞いたり見たり、YouTubeなど の発信を聞いていますと世の中すさんでいるな あと思わずにはおれない事件で溢れています。

老人のささやかな年金をだまし取る。子供を虐待する。親が子を殺すまた子が親を殺す。カッとしたから人を殺したという犯罪者がいると思えば、殺す相手は誰でもよかった等という犯罪者さえいます。

これらの事件が日常茶飯事に起きていますと、相当凶悪な事件でないと、あ!またかと言ったくらいの反応になります。

まさに衆生濁、人々の資質が衰えた状態になるという事なのでしょう。

人を傷つけたり傷つけられたりもうたくさんだ、政治や経済、思想でさえも右を向いても左を向いても、あの考えもこの考えも全く末通って一貫性の

あるものはなく、ある時はこう言いまた別の時はああ言い時代や情勢、金品に押し流されてこれと言って定まった完全なものなんてありゃしない。私たちはこの濁、汚いものに覆われた中をどう生きていけばいいのでしょうか。

とここまで私は五濁について皆さんに理解していただこうと具体的な例をあげて説明したつもりでしたが、待てよ!!この五濁というのは私の心のことを言い表したものではなかろうかと思いました。この現実が五濁に覆われているということもいえますが、何より私の心が末世に生きる人間として汚れに汚れ切っていて、少しも清らかさがないのではないか、お釈迦様はそういう自分が何より一番汚れを垂れ流している事に気づけと言われているような気がします。

大無量寿経の中にこういうお言葉があります。

『どうして人々は、世間の雑事をふりすてて、自分が健やかな間に、つとめて善を励み、ひとえに浄土に往生する事を願わないのであろうか。 そうすれば、とこしえにつきないいのちが恵まれるであろうに。なぜ、道を求めないのだろうか。 なにを期待して生きているのだろうか。いったいどういう楽しみを欲しているのであろうか。』

* 善を励み=浄土真宗では、聞法を意味します。

このお釈迦様のお言葉が、私の頭から離れずいつも噛み締めています。

このお言葉の要点はこの世を厭世(えんせい=世の中をうとましく思い、生きているのを辛いと思う事)しているのではなく逆に行く末を早く見定めて生き生きと生きなさいと諭しておられるのです。自分の内なる五濁に悩むがゆえに、浄土に生まれることを願わずにはいられなくなるのではないでしょうか。

親鸞聖人の時代も大火・飢饉・震災など多くの 災害に見舞われた時代でしたから、最晩年の 時期に浄信房に宛てたお手紙の中に、『なによ りも、去年今年老少男女多くの人々の死にあいて候らん事こそ、あわれに候へ。ただし生死無常のことわり、くわしく如来の説きおかせおはしまして候ふうへは、おどろきおぼしめすべからず候』とおっしゃっています。生死無常のことわりはすでに如来様がお説きくださっている、今更驚くことでもない、とおっしゃっています。

私のお友達が、『この10年で自分の回りがすっかり変わってしまった。』としみじみとおっしゃっていました。私も同感です。10年前の自分と今の自分、もちろん身体的にもそれなりに衰えてますが、住んでる家も違えば、子供の置かれている環境も、孫の数も、違います。確実に変化しています。そして何より違っているのは、身の回りの人、何人の人がなくなったでしょう。婦人会の90周年の記念写真を見てください。何人の会員の方々がお浄土に還られたか。一緒に旅行した私の兄も病に伏していますし、去年の旅が最後の旅行になりました。

もう自分が誰だかわからない人もおられます。 この変化は確実に自分の身に起きるのです。そ の前にせめて耳の聞こえる間に、見える間に、 自分が自分であることが解っている間に。"今" 聞かねばならない事を聞こうではありません か。
